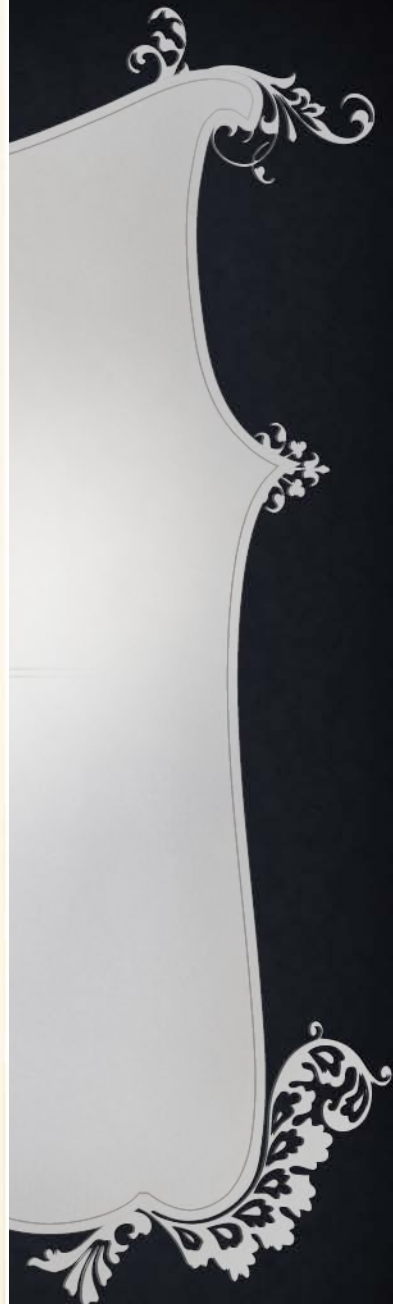

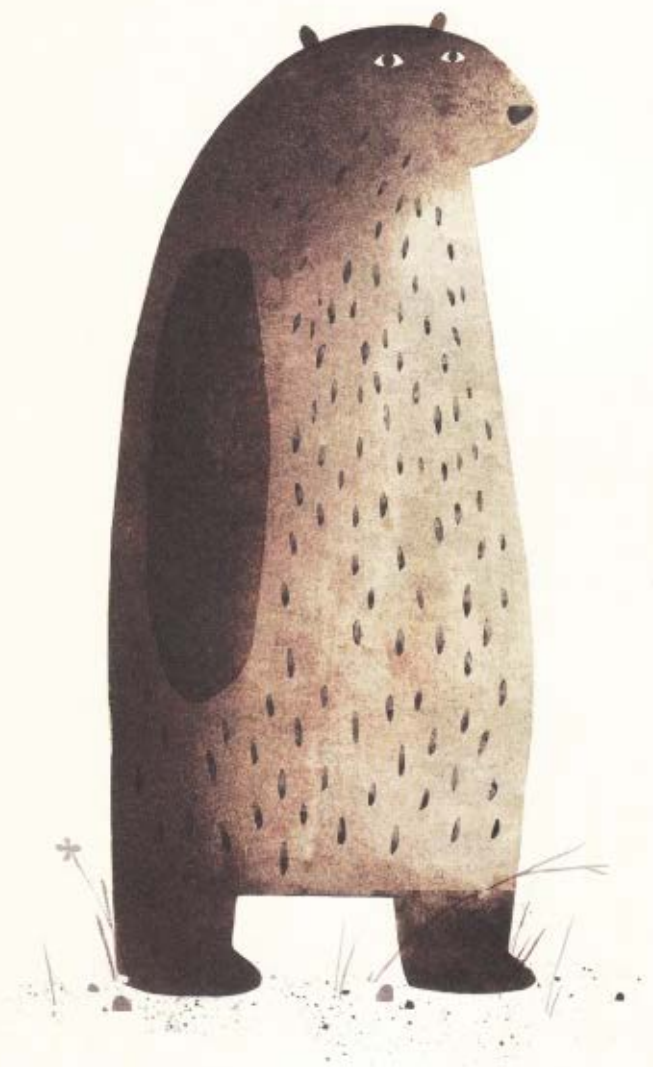

I haven't seen it.


I haven't seen any hats anywhere.

PROTAGONIST "Somebody"	<i>Who is the main character?</i> The main character is <u>the bear</u> .
MOTIVATION "Wanted"	<i>What does the main character want?</i> The main character wants <u>his hat back</u> .
CONFLICT "But..."	<i>What is the problem?</i> But the problem is <u>he can't find it</u> .
RISING ACTION "So"	<i>What does the main character do?</i> So the bear <u>asks everyone he meets until he remembers that he saw it on the rabbit</u> .
CONCLUSION "Then"	<i>What happens in the end?</i> Then in the end <u>the bear gets his hat back, and the rabbit is mysteriously missing</u> .
